#### **Important Safety Information**

**Always read this manual first before attempting to install or use this fireplace. For your safety, always comply with all warnings and safety instructions contained in this manual to prevent personal injury or property damage.**

**Please note: Once your E-Smart product has been installed and switched ON, the fireplace will take approximately 10 seconds to power up. This is a normal operating procedure and NOT a fault.**

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This guide is designed to aid in the installation and continued performance of this product. This product conforms with all health, safety, and environmental protection standards. For optimum performance this product requires a well-insulated location and indoor use.

## ELECTRICAL SAFETY

When using electrical appliances, basic precautions should always be followed to reduce the risk of fire, electric shock, and injury to persons, including the following:

1. Read all instructions before using this electric fireplace.
2. This fireplace is hot when in use. To avoid burns, do not let bare skin touch hot surfaces. The trim around the heater outlet becomes hot during heater operation. **DANGER:** High temperatures may be generated under certain abnormal conditions. Do not partially or fully cover or obstruct the front of this heater.
3. Extreme caution is necessary when any heater is used by or near children or people of reduced mobility and whenever the unit is left operating and unattended.
4. Young children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the appliance.
5. The appliance is not intended for use by young children or infirm persons without supervision.
6. In the event of a malfunction, disconnect power at the service panel and have the unit inspected by a reputable electrician before reusing.
7. If the power cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, or its service agent, or a qualified person in order to avoid a hazard.
8. Do not use outdoors.
9. Never locate fireplace where it may fall into a bathtub or other water container.
10. To disconnect the fireplace, turn the controls off, and turn off power to heater circuit at main electrical panel.
11. Do not run the cord under carpeting. Do not cover cord with throw rugs, runners, or the like. Arrange cord away from traffic area and where it will not be tripped over.
12. Do not locate the heater immediately below a fixed socket-outlet.

13. Do not insert or allow foreign objects to enter any ventilation or exhaust opening as this may cause an electric shock or fire, or damage to the heater.
14. To prevent a possible fire, do not block air intakes or exhaust in any manner.
15. All electrical heaters have hot and arcing or sparking parts inside. Do not use in areas where gasoline, paint, or flammable liquids are used or stored.
16. Use this fireplace only as described in this manual. Any other use not recommended by the manufacturer may cause fire, electric shock or injury to persons.
17. Do not change the plug in any way. Always plug heaters directly into a wall outlet/receptacle. Never use with an extension cord or relocatable power tap (outlet/power strip).
18. Do not burn wood or other materials in the electric fireplace.
19. Do not strike the fireplace glass.
20. Always use a certified electrician should new circuits or outlets be required.
21. Always use properly grounded, fused and polarized outlets.
22. Disconnect power supply before performing any cleaning, maintenance or relocation of the unit.
23. When transporting or storing the unit and cord, keep in a dry place, free from excessive vibration and store to avoid damage.

**NOTE: Changes or modifications not expressly approved by the party responsible for compliance could void warranty.**


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# INSTALLATION REQUIREMENTS

Review and consider all the following conditions before installation:

Ensure installation does not allow the electric fireplace to be in direct contact with building vapour barrier or insulation and meets all local building code. A 15 Amp, 120 Volt circuit is required. A dedicated circuit is preferred but not essential in all cases. A dedicated circuit will be required if, after installation, the circuit breaker trips or fuse blows on a regular basis when the heater is operating. Additional appliances on the same circuit may exceed the current rating of the circuit breaker.

Ensure the power cord is not installed so that it is pinched or against a sharp edge and ensure that the power cord is stored or secured to avoid tripping or snagging to reduce the risk of fire, electric shock or injury to persons. Construction and electrical outlet wiring must comply with local building codes and other applicable regulations to reduce the risk of fire, electric shock and injury to persons.



**WARNING:** To reduce the risk of fire, do not store or use gasoline or other flammable vapours or liquids in the vicinity of the heater.

1. Select a location that is not susceptible to moisture and is away from drapes, furniture and high traffic.
2. For ease of electrical hook up you may wish to locate the fireplace near an existing outlet (for plug-in convenience).
3. Remove electric fireplace, front glass and hardware from the box and remove all packaging materials before installation.
4. Store the fireplace in a safe, dry and dust free location until you are ready to install the fireplace.

## Grounding Instructions:


This product must be grounded. If it should malfunction or breakdown, grounding provides a path of least resistance for electric current to reduce the risk of electric shock.

This product is equipped with a cord having an equipment-grounding conductor and a grounding plug. The plug must be plugged into an appropriate outlet that is properly installed and grounded in accordance with all local codes and ordinances. **DANGER:** Improper connection of the equipment-grounding conductor can result in a risk of electric shock. Check with a qualified electrician or serviceman if you are in doubt as to whether the product is properly grounded. Do not modify the plug provided with the product – if it will not fit the outlet, have a proper outlet installed by a qualified electrician. This product is for use on a nominal 120-volt circuit and has a grounding plug that looks like the plug in Figure 1. Make sure that the product is connected to an outlet having the same configuration as the plug.

**WARNING:** Do not attempt to wire your own new outlets or circuits. To reduce the risk of fire, electric shock or injury to persons, always use a licensed electrician. PLEASE NOTE: This appliance cannot be wired into a wall and must use the provided cord and a wall outlet.

## CONVERTING TO GF / GF2 / GF3


The appliance is shipped in the GF3 configuration, however most models can be converted to be GF or GF2 depending on your preference.

#### **Glass Fronted**


A single glass panel at the front of the appliance.

A glass panel at the front and one side piece of glass. The glass can be either side.




### GF3 Configuration

A glass panel at the front and both side pieces of glass.



## INSTALLING THE SIDE PANELS / CONVERTING TO GF / GF2





The above table contains the minimum opening sizes required to house the appliance. This includes the recommended **2" (50mm)** air gap below.

**1 9/16" (40mm)** has been added to the width and **3/8" (10mm)** to the depth to allow ample space for the fire to fit. Please follow the Depth & Height measurement above and ensure the Width is no greater than the width of the chimney breast the product is being installed into.




Adhering to the **2" clearance** is crucial to the operation of the fire. This clearance space allows warm air from the case of the fire to escape and stop the unit's heater safety feature from being enabled.

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# INSTALLATION METHOD

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## INSTALLATION METHOD

**PLEASE NOTE: It is crucial to ensure that the product has a minimum internal clearance directly below the vents of 2”(50mm), this is to ensure that the product can circulate the required airflow for the heater unit.**

**Any faults as a result of ignoring the installation guidelines will invalidate the warranty.**

This product has been designed to be installed into a plaster board, or existing masonry chimney breast. Please note that any corner style models are not suitable to be installed into an existing chimney breast. Please seek advice from a professional, with reference to the structural integrity of the installation site.

If the product is to be installed into an open chimney or flue, it is important that the chimney/flue is blocked off to prevent any up/down drafts and falling debris which could restrict and alter the airflow to the product.

It is also important to ensure that the product has a minimum clearance directly below the vents of 2” (50mm), this is to ensure that the product can circulate the required airflow for the heater unit.

The product should never be sealed into an opening with the use of silicones, adhesives, or wet plaster as this can also alter the airflow and hinder any further servicing of the product.

### **Installing Product:**

Each product can be supplied with 1 wall bracket as an optional extra, and two wall brace brackets. There are 4x transit brackets, and 2x brace bars which need to be removed before installation.

Establish the desired finished height from floor level to the bottom of the plaster kit of the product.

Fix the wall bracket to the wall ensuring to use the correct hardware fixings given the wall construction, Plaster board or Solid Wall.


Lift and hook the product onto the wall bracket and secure using the wall brace brackets.

Once the product is secured to the wall and connected to the power supply, the false construction such as plaster board wall or chimney breast can be formed around it.

It is important to allow for the finished face board when setting the depth of the frame construction.

It is essential to include header/Lintel at the required height to ensure the appliance does not support the weight of the finished wall.

Prepare the Cut-Out in the Plasterboard or Finishing Board and install ensuring that the plaster kit edges are fitting to the inside of the Cut-out of the board.




**PLEASE NOTE: Once the product has been fitted into place, please ensure the fire is plugged in and tested to check the fan and ribbons are aligned correctly, and the ribbons are moving freely. It may take up to 20 mins of usage to see proper alignment.**

## INSTALLING THE SIDE CHROME PANELS

Chrome side panels are available as an optional extra on all models.

Alternatively, the chrome side panels can be attached to the case with the magnets as shown below.



Ensure that the magnets are positioned with the short side touching the case.

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



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
# INSTALLING THE FRONT GLASS PANEL

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**Please Note: The glass suction pad comes with the E72 and Avesta models. On all other models, the glass suction pad is an optional extra.**



On 1800/Avesta or e2400/Karlstad models, apply the Suction Lifter to the glass and position the bottom edge of the glass first, then pivot the glass into the appliance. If not using a glass sucker, carefully hold the glass on either end and follow the same process. 2 people may be required for this to ensure the glass is carefully supported at all times.



### Warning

The Suction Lifter is provided to assist in moving the glass **NEVER** as the sole support of the glass. Always support the glass throughout the entire process until the glass is fully fitted. The glass is toughened safety glass and if broken will shatter into many small chunks.

Then replace the top and bottom glass retainers.


## **E-Smart Cloud App**

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## PRODUCT OPERATION

The appliance is operated by the E-Smart CCloud App, the main standby power switch to the E-Smart product is located to the right of the heater outlet, which is marked with a light bulb image, to activate the product, this switch must be switched to the “**ON**” position.

The first time the E-Smart product is activated both the illumination and heater will function, to switch the heater “**OFF**” simply reduce the room temperature down to 10 degrees on the App control.



**Heater unit cut-out - (This is a safety feature, to safeguard against further damage to the product).**

If the airflow is restricted the heater will automatically turn off. This can occur due to incorrect installation or obstruction.

To reset the heater function:

- Isolate from the mains power supply.
- Leave product to cool.
- After a suitable cooling down period, remove the obstruction if obstructed, and check installation.
- After 10 minutes the thermo switch (cut-out) in the heater will reset.

Please note that both the effect fan and heater fan omit a low decibel noise, both of which are normal operating characteristics.

The E-Smart Cloud app is a WiFi app that can be used with both smart phones and tablet devices, and is available on both the Apple App Store and Google Play Store.


Before getting started with the app, connect the fire to the mains power, and push the rocker switch to the ON position.



To begin using the app you first need to pair your appliance to the app, we have created a video on our Vimeo channel to guide you through the process of pairing your appliance to your smart phone or tablet. Scan the QR code to be taken to the video and get started.


Alternatively, search the Apple or Google store for the e-cloud app and download it to your device. Open the settings on your device and connect to the fire's wireless connection. Then open the e-smart cloud app, open the settings panel on the app's Home Page. Scroll down to the IOT Registration and fill in your details, press save. Then select your home router from the drop down box, and enter your router password, press save and connect. The app will now pair to your device, this may take a few moments. Once completed the Home Page will show on your device.

## HOME PAGE



Click on your fire settings to enter the Control Overview page.

## CONTROL OVERVIEW



To adjust the desired temperature of your fire ensure that the heater is selected on the Home Page in the previous step. Then press, hold, and rotate the temperature dial to set the temperature.


The animation drop down allows you to choose the flame effect for your fire, more flame effects are available to download from our shop on the Home Page.

By clicking on lighting settings you can adjust the flame brightness by pressing, holding, and sliding the tab at the bottom of the screen. Slide left to lower the brightness, and right to increase the brightness. You can adjust the fuel bed brightness in the same way with the lower tab slider.

To change the speed of the LED flame effect single press the speed setting option, and slide the top dial left to slow it down, and right to increase the speed. Likewise with the fuel bed speed, slide the lower tab left to slow it down and right to increase it.




Single press the clock icon on the Home Page to begin programming the Timer.



The above screen will now show your set timer. To delete the timer press the bin icon. To add an additional timer scroll down and repeat the process. Press the Back button to return to the Home Page.



### Changing the temperature.

Alexa can only change the temperature between 10° and 32°.

"Alexa, set temperature to 27 degrees."

"Alexa, make it warmer in there."

Increases the temperature by 3°

"Alexa, make it cooler in there."

Decreases the temperature by 3°

### Changing the flame effect.

"Alexa, set animation to still."

"Alexa, set animation to breathe."



## USING THE REMOTE

**Top Left - Turn your fire ON and OFF**

**Middle Left - Turn your heater ON**

**Bottom Left - This button has no functionality on Evoflame models**



**Top Right - Turn your feature lights ON and OFF**

**Middle Right - Turn your heater OFF**

**Bottom Right - Adjust the brightness.**

With the remote control the heater is pre-set to 28°, if you would like to adjust the temperature you need to do this through the app.

The brightness button adjusts the brightness of the fire by 0%, 25%, 50%, and 100%.

## RETROFITTING THE REMOTE CONTROL

In order to retro-fit your remote, please ensure you follow these steps **BEFORE** you attempt to use the remote control system.


To begin the retro-fit of the remote control, press the 'update' icon on the e-smart cloud app home screen.


Once the fire has updated, select the settings icon on the home screen.
